

- We are bringing in the structural beams for the inner walls of the second floor
- Then, we are finishing the roof over the front of the building
- Soon, we will pour the concrete floor over the gravel on the first floor

This summer Shechem's doors will open and the anticipation is growing. It has been life-giving to see the details come together- having a schedule created, membership solidified, and rental space and partnership forms created. Now we get to pick out furnishings and plan a grand opening. In all of that, it's easy to get caught up in the process of creating, planning and fundraising and in turn forgetting why we are doing all of this. Taking a look at what is currently happening at Hope Street is a good reminder.

A member recently came into the office for help. She has a family and works and is often caught up in balancing it all. She came down with news of getting into nursing school. We were excited about the prospect of her doing something for herself but she was worried about the financial aspect, especially since she still has tens of thousands of dollars in student loans from her first go around. She had been searching for scholarships and kept finding her way onto scamming websites that needed you to pay in order to "apply" for a scholarship. As staff, we've always had the capability to meet people where they are at, so after an hour or so of research, she had a page of leads.

One member has had trouble sorting through anger and grief, and moving forward. We set him up with a counselor and have regularly spent time listening. He has begun letting things go and being okay with where he is at. A third member just had a baby and needed

supplies, despite not having income. We gave her what we had and connected her to resources to find what we did not. Other members helped watch her children during delivery. All three members got their different needs met.

Hope Street is a place for all to land and to be, regardless of our backgrounds or current needs. We give people a place to build relationships, gain support and work towards healing and achieving goals. Shechem at Hope Street is allowing more people into this, providing opportunity to experience transformation.
