Jamarra and her boys came to Hope Street after experiencing trauma. At first, Jamarra struggled with transitioning to life at Hope Street. She was stressed by life and financial burdens, and her boys were missing school.

Thanks to sessions with one of our partners, James Place Counseling, and support from Hope Street, things started to turn around for Jamarra and the kids.

The boys opened up more and began playing games with our volunteers, making friends with other kids at Hope Street, and building healthy habits like attending their virtual school classes.

Jamarra began attending community meetings at Hope Street and gaining support from others. She started school discovered a better outlook on life, and is now employed.

Hope Street members for 2 years


When Van and Jazzmin came to Hope Street, they were jobless and homeless after escaping a toxic living situation. The couple was expecting a baby girl soon and were seeking stability for their daughter — something they didn't have as children.

When Jazzmin's mother Karey moved into Hope Street for help with addiction, it was a chance to begin healing the generational trauma that led to a fractured family.

At Hope Street, Van and Jazz have had the chance to confront their family's pasts, marked by addiction and criminal activity. They've had space and support to work through their experiences and rediscover their strength. Meanwhile, Karey has been staying sober and all three have found jobs.

They've built healthy relationships with fellow Hope Street members and have a newfound sense of resilience to draw on in the face of adversity. The couple, along with their beautiful daughter Valencia, are now looking forward to living life outside of our walls.



with them forever.




WE'REDEDIGATE TO CLOSING GAPS BETWEEN THE BLACK AND WHITE POPULATIONS IN MILWAUKEE.
